

Jeffrey Horowitz, Theatre for a New Audience (TFANA) Founding Artistic Director, was introduced to theatre at age 16 by Ms. Francis Hall, an English literature and drama teacher at Windsor Mountain School. He subsequently attended University of California, Los Angeles and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. As an actor, Horowitz appeared on Broadway, Off-Broadway, in regional theatre and film before founding TFANA in 1979. Horowitz has served on the Panel of the New York State Council on the Arts, the Board of Directors of Theatre Communications Group, the Advisory Board of The Shakespeare Society and the Artistic Directorate of Shakespeare's Globe, London.

Michael M. Kaiser Chairman, DeVos Institute of Arts and Nonprofit Management, President Emeritus, John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Few arts professionals have had a greater global impact than Michael M. Kaiser.

Founder of the DeVos Institute, Michael also served as President of the Kennedy Center and as Executive Director of the Royal Opera House, American Ballet Theatre, and the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater Foundation.

The DeVos Institute has provided arts administration training and consulting for governments and institutions across the US and more than 80 countries, including Yale, Oxford, Theatre for a New Audience, National September 11 Memorial and Museum, Public Art Fund, and Paul Taylor and Martha Graham Dance Companies.

Michael is the author of eight books, including 2008's *The Art of the Turnaround*. Currently a Professor at the University of Maryland, he has also taught at NYU and the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg.

His awards and honors include: the Capezio Award, the St. Petersburg 300 Medal, a U.S. Department of State Citation, the Blacks in Dance Award, and China's "Award for Cultural Exchange". He holds honorary doctorates from Georgetown and The University of Missouri.

THEATRE FOR A NEW AUDIENCE

Founded in 1979 by Jeffrey Horowitz, and led by Horowitz and Managing Director Dorothy Ryan, TFANA is a home for Shakespeare and other contemporary playwrights. TFANA explores the ever-changing forms of world theatre and creates a dialogue between the language and ideas of Shakespeare and diverse authors, past and present. TFANA also builds associations with artists from around the world and supports their development through productions, commissions and residences.

TFANA has played on Broadway, Off-Broadway, and toured internationally and nationally. It serves audiences of all ages and backgrounds; is devoted to accessibly priced tickets including its New Deal, which provides \$20 tickets for those aged 30 and under and full-time students of any age. TFANA is also committed to a civic role. It created and runs the largest in-depth programs in the NYC Public Schools to introduce Shakespeare, as well as a playwrighting program, which together have served more than 140,000 students since 1984.

In 2001, TFANA became the first American theatre invited to bring a production of Shakespeare to the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC), and in 2007 TFANA returned to the RSC. In 2025, TFANA was invited to bring its production of Shakespeare's *The Merchant of Venice*, starring John Douglas Thompson as Shylock and directed by Arin Arbus, to the Royal Lyceum Theatre, Edinburgh, Scotland.

In 2013, TFANA opened its first permanent home, Polonsky Shakespeare Center, Brooklyn, with the 299-seat Samuel H. Scripps Mainstage and the 50-seat Theodore Rogers Studio.
